and -ak meaning little. In Persian,

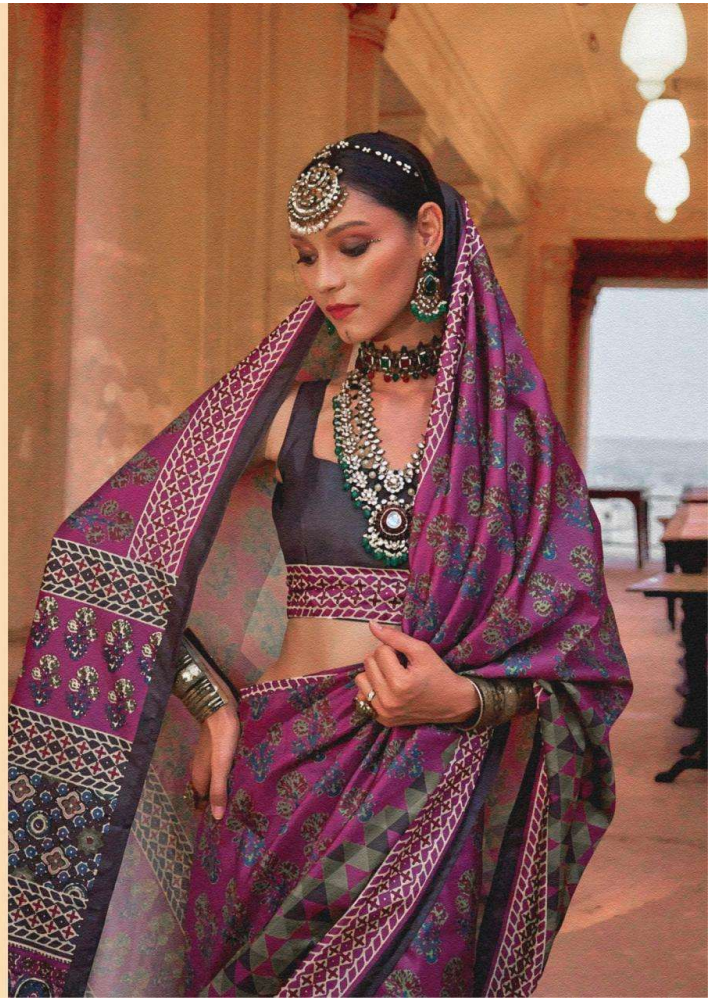


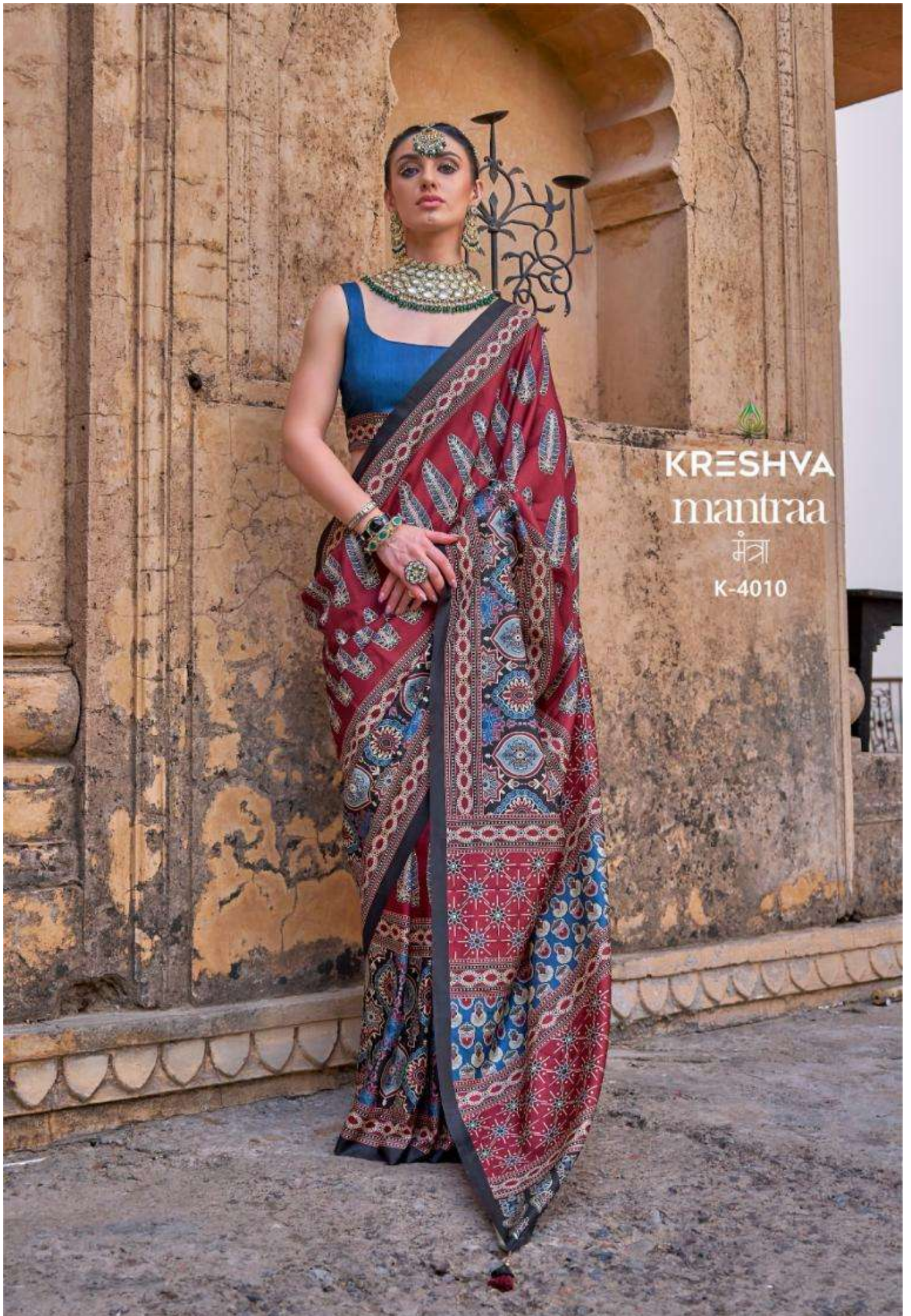
Early human settlements in the lower Indus Valley found a way of cultivating and using

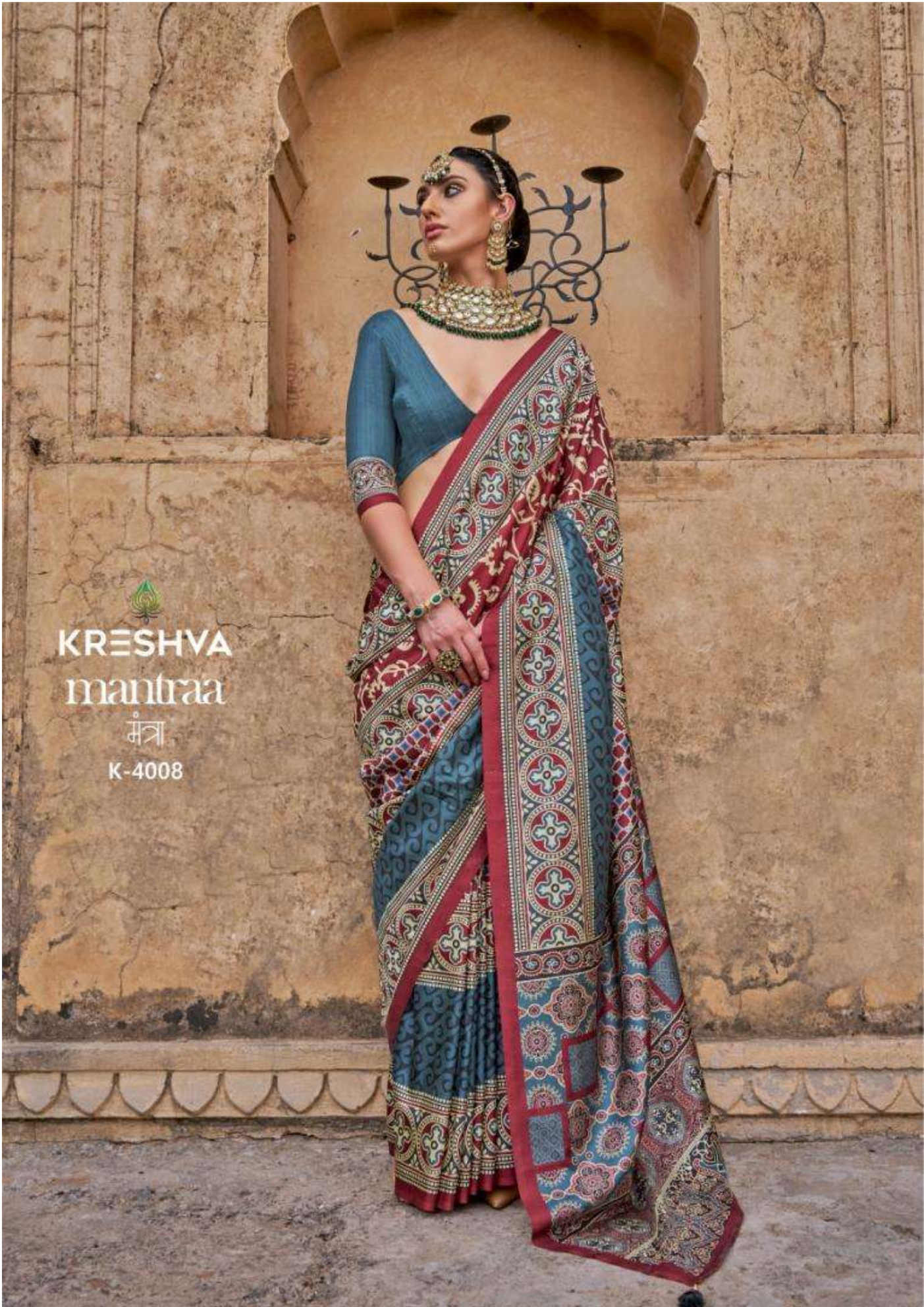

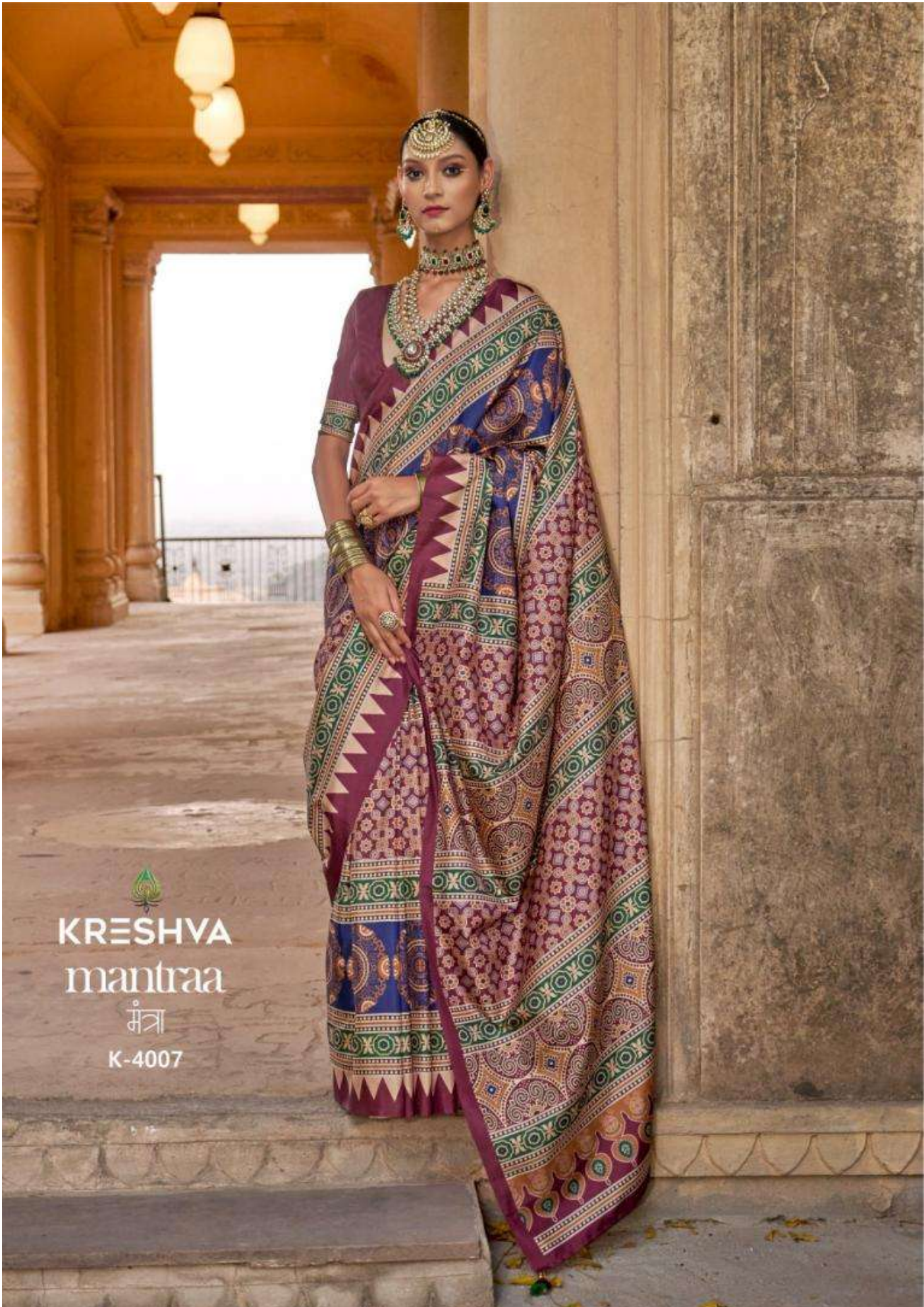
